IN MEMORIAM

avid V. Becker, M.D. passed away in Manhattan on January 31, 2010. For more than 50 years, Dr. Becker was a beloved member of the NewYork-Presbyterian Hospital/Weill Cornell Medical Center family. He began as a resident in the Department of Medicine at what was then New York Hospital from 1954-1955, and was recruited by the Chief of Medicine to set up a radioisotope laboratory. In 1955, he became the founding director of the Division of Nuclear Medicine, a position he held until 1995. Dr. Becker

was Professor of Radiology and Medicine at Weill Cornell Medical College and Attending Radiologist at NewYork-Presbyterian Hospital. He was an internationally recognized thyroidologist and a pioneer in the use of radioactive materials for the diagnosis and treatment of thyroid disease.
